

FERNHILL VISITOR MAP

Fernhill is a place to explore trails, observe wildlife, learn about water and enjoy nature. Fernhill is designated an important bird area and is home to beavers, frogs, coyotes and other wildlife. It's also an active water treatment facility, where water is cleaned and cooled before it returns to the Tualatin River.



FERNHILL TRAILS

Three miles of trails connect the parking lot and Visitor Station to the Water Garden, Fernhill Lake and wetland habitat. All trails are flat with a maximum of +/- 10ft elevation gain.



Water Garden Loop

0.6 miles, shade/sun, ADA accessible paved and gravel trail surface Start at the parking lot and choose a paved or gravel path to the Water Garden. Once there, explore the waterfalls, bridges and landscape.

Fernhill Lake Loop

1.1 miles sun, gravel trail surface

Stroll around Fernhill Lake to see a variety of wildlife and plants. The loop includes benches and covered shelters, 0.75 miles can be added with the Eagles Marsh and out and back trails.

Dabblers Marsh Loop

2 miles, shade/sun, gravel and wood chip trail surface

This trail passes through edge habitat and is great for spotting songbirds. There are no benches past the Water Garden, and portions of the trail will be muddy during winter months.
